**Sometimes, I need to go
to the doctor.**

Doctors help me stay
healthy and feel better
when I am sick or hurt.



**Before I go, a grown-up
might tell me what to expect.

Someone at the desk may ask for my name and ask me questions.

It's okay to feel nervous. I can take deep breaths or squeeze a stress ball.
